

THE GARDENS

You're invited to take a stroll along our edible garden trail at your leisure, and to meet the gardeners, who'll be delighted to talk to you about their edible gardening experiences.

1 Looking Well, King Street

2 John Vendy: 1 Burnside, Low Bentham Road

This is an organic vegetable garden.

Visitors will find winter tares (vetch) growing, to be dug in to enrich the soil.

3 Edible Bed, High Bentham Station: by westbound platform waiting room

4 Adrian Horn: Overdale, Springfield.

Similar to an allotment in size, it is protected by fencing and apple trees.

Adrian has created a magnificent pond and you'll be able to meet his brood of hens.

5 Sue & John Pilkington: Kronah, Springfield
By Springfield Crescent

This garden is a wonderful example of companion planting. It has a number of beds where vegetables are rotated each year to encourage good yields. You'll see a fabulous variety of vegetables, fruit, herbs, shrubs and flowers growing together, including an impressive runner bean wigwam and potatoes growing in bags
